With seven years of crushing, grinding, flotation and dewatering experience across WA copper-gold and iron ore processing operations, I bring strong shift discipline, control room competency, and an instinct for catching incipient circuit drift before it becomes downtime.

My current role with a Tier-1 iron ore producer involves operating the wet plant – primary crushing, scrubber, screening, dewatering and product stockpile circuits – on a 2:1 even-time roster. In the last 12 months I have caught and corrected three significant cyclone overflow drift events early in shift, preventing approximately 8 hours of cumulative production loss. My shift superintendent has cited this kind of proactive catch as the reason I was asked to mentor new starters.

Previously I operated the SAG and ball mill grinding circuit and rougher/scavenger/cleaner flotation banks at a WA copper-gold concentrator. I am Cert III qualified in Process Plant Operations, comfortable across Citect, Wonderware InTouch and PI Vision SCADA platforms, and hold current Confined Space Entry, Working at Heights, Gas Test Atmospheres, Senior First Aid, Standard 11, and Issue Permits to Work qualifications.

I am told my strengths are structured shift handover, calm response to upset conditions, and a willingness to coach new starters during their first three months on shift. I am available for immediate start and comfortable on either day or night rotations.
